

ESNZ COACH-RECOGNITION OF CURRENT COMPETENCY



Recognition of Current Competency (RCC) is a process which acknowledges skills and knowledge obtained through formal education and training systems, or work and life experience for ESNZ members.

The process recognises coaches' current competencies (knowledge and skills) and measures it against a qualification or the modules that comprise a qualification.

In order to be deemed competent in a module, a coach must demonstrate their ability to meet the required standard as specified in the Learning Outcomes.

ESNZ offers applicants the opportunity to apply to have the skills and knowledge that they already possess to be formally recognised within the ESNZ Coach training pathway.

For either option, you must be a member of ESNZ

Fast Tracking:

Opportunities will exist, from 2018 onwards, for Fast Track weekends for existing Coaches from Development and Performance level. These will involve groups of coaches working with coach educators to demonstrate their knowledge and skills.

Cost (one off per level):

- The cost will vary depending on your level of experience/qualification and also how many disciplines you wish to be recognised as a Coach of.
- The cost covers the ESNZ Coaching workbooks and also the Coach Educator's time for working with you and assessing your coaching level

Proposed costs for existing coaches:

Development Equine Management and Riding RCC*:

\$180 for one/the first discipline in this application

\$60 for each additional discipline in this application (ie: fee for three Olympic disciplines - \$300)

Development Coach RCC:

\$200 for one/the first discipline in this application

\$150 for each additional discipline in this application (ie: fee for three Olympic disciplines - \$500)

Performance Equine Management and Riding RCC*:

\$200 for one/the first discipline in this application

\$70 for each additional discipline in this application (ie: fee for three Olympic disciplines - \$340)

Performance Coach RCC:

\$280 for one/the first discipline in this application

\$180 for each additional discipline in this application (ie: fee for three Olympic disciplines - \$640)

*Equine Management and Riding qualifications may be awarded based on performance/results of rider, on a case by case basis, without the need for assessment

Benefits:

- Once your coaching level has been determined you may register as an ESNZ Coach. You will also be required to produce a current first aid certificate and you will be Police Vet Checked by ESNZ.
- Once you are a registered ESNZ Coach you will have a Coach profile uploaded on the ESNZ website and have access to Coach seminars and workshops.
- You will also be eligible for cover under ESNZ's insurance policy for Public and Statutory Liability, as long as you are a financial member of ESNZ (Full or Non-Competing) and have current ESNZ Coach registration with current first aid certificate.
- You will be able to advertise any clinics on the ESNZ website and also the ESNZ Coaching Facebook page.
